A number of empty casks were also found, and two others full of rough salt. Three canvanss dresses hung against the wall; and every thing denoted the place was the nightly rendezvous of a gang of resurrection men, who had here deposited the fruits of their depredations on the abodes of the dead. There were no less than 22 corpses in the cellar. Those found in the sacks were quite fresh, and appeared to have been exhumined in the course of the preceding night. All the dead bodies found in the cellar and on board the Latona, amounting to 33. namely-15 men, 10 women, 5 boys and 3 girls-were conveyed to the dead house, and after an inquiry into the subject before a coroner, were interred on Tuesday afternoon, in the Parish cemetery. The siench from the bodies was sorgreat, that the air in the streets, through which the cart that contained them passed, was completely impregnated with the off usi e effluvia.
