

April;—The most recent letters from Zante and Prevesa confirm the news that Ibrahim Pacha was wounded mortally in the last attack on Missolonghi, 3d March, N. S. An English vessel arrived yesterday from Malta; the Captain has stated to the magistrates that he met near Cerigo, the Greek fleet, which having learnt a large convoy of Turkish vessels was on the way from Egypt to the Morea, had sailed in quest of it, and captured almost the whole. This explains the delay of the Greek fleet in proceeding to Missolonghi; but it is hoped that nothing will now retard it. A letter of 6th April says, that Missolonghi still holds out, and even triumphs.
