**NEW-YORK, July 6.**

We learn from Capt. Wheeler, that the British brig of war Lion, sailed from Nassau, N. P. about 10 days since, in pursuit of a long black brigantine, manned principally with blacks, which it was reported had committed acts of piracy on a British and an American brig off Henegagua, and murdered the whole of the crew of the latter. The semi-annual examination of the Pupils attending the Grammar School annexed to the College, under the immediate care of the Rev. G. M. CAULEY, took place at the College on the 24th July, agreeably to the Regulations; on which occasion the Pupils acquitted themselves greatly to the satisfaction of the examiners. In the Greek and Latin Classes they showed a very accurate knowledge of Grammar and Prosody; and their translations were neat and elegant; displaying good taste, and a choice of words seldom to be met with in those of their years. One Class was also examined in Euclid's Elements, and both from the demonstration of the propositions and the intelligent answers to some incidental questions which were put to them, showed that they were well initiated into the principles of the severe and rigid, though beautiful mode of investigation, which distinguishes the Geometry of Ancient Greece. The result of the whole examination was highly creditable to their own attention and diligence, and reflected great honor on their able, zealous and learned Preceptor. The Examination, also, of the Pupils attending the English School, took place on the subsequent day; and they likewise, as usual, gave much satisfaction to the Trustees, the Parents of the Children, and the Visitors. The specimens which they exhibited in Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Grammar and Geography, were convincing proofs of the great proficiency which they have made under the Tuition of Mr. HOEBROOK, particularly since the last examination.
