COLONIAL SUMMARY.

CANADA.—*Neilson's Gazette* of the 6th inst. states, that fine rains have improved the crops amazingly, and that the effects of the late severe drought will not be so great as was anticipated.—The *Canadian Spectator* of the 8th inst. says "We understand from a Gentleman who has lately been on an excursion in the country—that there is a most beautiful prospect of an abundant harvest of all the fruits of the Earth."—The *U. C. Farmer's Journal* states, that Sir Peregrine Maitland has ordered a survey of the St. Lawrence; and that the editor has no doubt the result will be the speedy commencement of a canal of suitable dimensions to pass ships from the Lakes to the Ocean.—Sir Peregrine Maitland has expressed the greatest indignation and abhorrence at the attack on the office of the Colonial Advocate, and dismissed in utter disgrace one of the clerks of his office, (*Mr. Lyons*), who had been a ring-leader in this disgraceful transaction. This is as it should be, and well becomes that honourable and exalted character which a representative of our beloved King should always maintain.
