Several cases of Desertion from His Majesty's Forces, having recently happened here, we have deemed it advisable to publish the following Letter addressed to the Magistrates of the several Counties in this Province; and we doubt not that the exertions of His Majesty's loyal and faithful Inhabitants, in their respective stations, will be used to put a stop to so serious an evil.
 Fredericton, 3d June, 1826

GENTLEMEN
SEVERAL cases of Desertion from His Majesty's Forces, having recently happened here, and the delinquents, excepting in one instance, having escaped; His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has thought proper to call the attention of the Magistrates of the several Counties, to this serious and, as it is to be feared, growing evil.

Soldiers are never permitted to travel in any part of the Province without a Pass, so signed and authenticated as not to be mistaken, and, although Deserters will always assume a disguise, yet a little vigilant attention will easily discover them; and beside the pecuniary reward given for their apprehension, there are powerful motives which should operate upon the mind of every faithful subject, and prompt him to lend his aid to detect and prevent these offences. His Excellency therefore relying upon the zeal of the Magistrates, requests that they will, in their several districts, not only use their own best exertions, but also make known the subject of this Letter, and call upon the Inhabitants at large, who from their well known Loyalty, will, His Excellency is convinced, need no further stimulus to excite them, in their respective stations, to use their best endeavours in the discharge of so important a duty, which they owe to their King and Country.

Extract of a Letter from Richibucto, dated the 7th March 1826.

The Hermaphrodite Brig Caroline of Quebec, loaded with Deal, was picked up in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, by the Pilots of this Port and brought in here; she was water logged and not a person on board, or any paper or document whereby the owner or master's name could be found out.

The Lord Bishop of Nova-Scotia has communicated his intention of visiting this Province towards the latter end of the present month, and will leave Digby for St. John about the 25th; from whence he will proceed immediately to the Seat of Government, where a meeting of the Clergy will be held, and every preparation made to receive His Lordship with all due respect. His Lordship, we understand, means to extend his visit, if possible, to all parts of the Province, where his presence is required, and perform those Rites and Ceremonies so necessary to the well being and good ordering of the Church; and we are authorized to state that attendance will be given in Christ Church, Fredericton, by the Rector of the Parish on Wednesdays and Fridays from 12 to 1 o'Clock, to examine such young persons as may be disposed to present themselves for Confirmation.

His Lordship has already embarked in the Government Schooner Chebucto, for this place, having his Family with him.

On Saturday the 3d inst was launched about 5 miles above Fredericton, in the Parish of Kingsclear The Spring Hill, a vessel of about 340 tons, built by Messrs Dow & Murray; and on Saturday last in Fredericton. The Barque Heroine, built by Mr Brown, of about 325 Tons.

Boston and Maine Steam Boat Line.
 On Sunday night last the Steam Boat Le-

STATOR, Capt. Porter, arrived here from New-York, via Newport, 24 hours and a half from the latter place, with several passengers. This superb boat is intended to run regularly between Boston and Portland, and connect with a Line which is to extend eventually to Windsor, Nova-Scotia, touching at the numerous intermediate Ports and Rivers. The Legislator is over 200 tons, measures on the deck 115 feet in length and 35 in width. She has two Cabins for Gentlemen, and one for Ladies, fitted in the most elegant style - and can accommodate 100 passengers. Great attention has been paid to render the boat safe as well as handsome and convenient; and a double bulkhead is erected round the boiler. This welcome vessel now lies at India wharf, and has been visited and admired by great numbers of our citizens. It appears to us, from the rapidly increasing population of Nova-Scotia, New-Brunswick, Maine and Massachusetts, that this enterprize must at last be a very lucrative concern, as well as one of much public interest. The Line will commence running without loss of time.

Dreadful Catastrophe. - It appears that His Majesty's Ship Algerine Capt. Weymss, upset in a dreadful squall, in the Mediterranean, which threw Sir H. Neale's ship, the Revenge of 74 guns, on her beam ends, and tore all her sails to ribbons. The Algerine was about three miles astern of the Admiral, and disappeared in an instant with every soul on board.

The wreck of the British brig Susan, of New-Brunswick was fallen in with on the 19th. March on Brown's Bank, timber loaded and full of water. No persons on board.
