GENTLEMEN

NEVERAL cases of Desertion from His Majesty's Forces, having recently happened here, and the delinquents, excepting in one instance, having escaped; His Soldiers are never permitted to trayel in any part of the Province without a Pass, so signed and authenticated as not to be mistaken,
