SENTENCE ON JOSEPH CWYNN The Clerk of the Court having made

Proclamation for all persons to be silent on pain of imprisonment, while Judgment of Death was passing, the chief Justice pronounced Sentence nearly as follows :---

JOSEPH GWYNN --- You have been in-April, in the year of our Lord one thousand dicted for the murder of Henry Folger. To the indictment you have pleaded Not Guilty, and put yourself for deliverance upon God and your Country. You have
