GENTLEMEN.--For the honor which has been conferred upon me by the congratulations of the Members of His Majesty's Council, and Members of the late House of Assembly, the Magistrates, the Clergy, and other Freeholders of Bermuda, upon my appointment to the See of Nova-Scotia; and by the satisfaction they have been pleased to express upon my visit to this interesting part of my charge, I feel very lively gratitude, and beg you to accept my sincerest assurances of it.

It appeared to be a duty to make as early a visit as possible to the Bermudas; for the discharge of that duty I came among you; but it was not easy to anticipate the feelings which the ready attention and unbounded kindness of the inhabitants of all parts of these Islands have awakened. They will be cherished with delight, and cannot fail to preserve the esteem and affectionate regard which they have created.

If any benefit has been derived to the Church in this Colony from the first visit of a Bishop, it must be attributed, under the blessing of Providence, to the ready inclination of the Clergy and Laity to make it profitable.

The promptitude with which your Churches (generally) have been put into a very neat state--the zeal with which measures have been taken for the substantial repairs which some of them require; the crowded assemblies I have met within their walls; the attentive and becoming deportment by which the congregations have been distinguished; and the deeply serious manner in which a large portion of all classes of the Inhabitants of these Islands have participated of an holy Rite, which was never within their reach until the present time, have made impressions on me which cannot be forgotten, and cannot be remembered without perpetuating the esteem and regard which they have excited.

For all your kind wishes I repeat my warmest thanks, and beg to assure you that my prayers will be continually offered for abundant blessing upon the inhabitants of these Islands.
