From the proceeds of the sale of Public Lots in this Town, a liberal sum has been granted by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and His Majesty's Council, for the purpose of erecting a National School House; a measure that cannot fail to give general satisfaction, and affords one of the many proofs of the paternal interest, those who rule over us take in the welfare and improvement of this rising Place; for, of all the public buildings about to be erected here, there is not one of which we stand more in need than a building of this nature; and there is here, if rightly considered, of more importance to this community, or that will extend eventually, more to its internal respectability. We have hitherto laboured under every difficulty in the want of a proper and convenient building; and for the existence of our School at this present time, we are indebted solely to the indulgence of the Magistrates of the County, through whose kindness we have been allowed to occupy the Court House for a short period.

A neat and appropriate building will be immediately erected on an economical scale as possible, and when completed, the Institution will be placed on a creditable and permanent footing, and afford an opportunity to the rising generation of acquiring such useful and religious knowledge, as, without expence, place be it ever so wealthy, can be desired; for every thinking man will be convinced that the people are instructed in all that is necessary to their good, the more they are instructed, the more they will be able to see what that good is, and the more they will be able to attain it; the more they will be able to abstain from the use of those things which are prejudicial to the health and safety of a country; consequently to their own safety and security here, and what will be the result, in a word, their best interests will be promoted.

An extraordinary person appeared in this Town on the early part of last week, and announced himself as a Preacher of the Gospel, professing not to belong to any particular denomination of Christians, but that he was one of those who believe on the Lord Jesus; he expressed his firm belief that the inhabitants of this Province experienced great mercies and judgment upon it from the Lord for its wickedness, and that if it does not take warning thereby and repent, it will be visited by another still more dreadful. He stated that he came to offer his services to the people in preaching the Gospel, and that if they were rejected he would depart, & shake off the dust from his feet, having performed the duty required of him. His dress was in the Quaker style, the character of his countenance nearest to the representation given of some of the despots we have ever seen, and his general outward appearance, what we should imagine the primitive Christians to have been. He came from Upper Canada and was on his way to Miramichi.

The Weather.—Last Tuesday and Wednesday were the hottest days ever remembered in this Season of the year, in this Town we Thermometer, on the former day stood in the shade at 90, and on the latter at 93; on Thursday it fell to 54, and afterwards became uncomfortably cold. It is a story almost too marvellous to credit, but it is confidently affirmed by several men, who were working in a field some few miles above Fredericton, that the fence near them was actually set on fire by the heat of the sun; there is now every appearance of a serious drought.
