Halifax Oct. 4.

The brig Chance, Ellis, from St. John, N. B. for Jam. has been wrecked near Fire Place, L. I. Cargo expected to be saved.

Port of Richibucto.

Sept. 24.--Ar. Brig Alexandra, Gorley, from Maryport, 35 days; Experiment, Vatt, Stranraer, 49 days; Hannah, Mar-ews, Dublin; Ocean, Blain, Maryport; elson, Cockburn, do.; Huskisson, Rob-n P. E. Island.

The Experiment, on the 21st inst. spoke Came North.--The Brig Alexander of erdeen, bound to Bay Chaleur, having in the Brig John Teasdale or Tweasdale, South Shields, timber laden, from Que-waer logged, and abandoned.

The brig Laurel ar. at Havana, 30th from Liverpool, having on board an o, and one man late of the Br. schr. of Magpie, which they received from the fr. Pylades. They informed that the Mid been cast away, about ten leagues S. of Mariel, and all on board but selves perished. They were taken off a fr. by the brig Aspasia, of N. York, and on board the P.

Salem Sept. 18.

Ed brigue Eliza, Benson 108 days from acke, (Sumatra) and 31 from

Pernambuco. Lat 39, long. 67, spoke the Cadmus, 3 days from N. York for Havre; was informed they had on board the capt. and crew of the schr. Neptune, of Pictou, N. S. which was upset in a gale, on the 8th, lat 38, long. 69. They were taken on board the Eliza, at their request, Capt. Allyn, of the C. supplying us with water, fowls, and vegetables. This unfortunate crew are all much debilitated and bruised, having been under water the principal part of the time, for ten days, without one drop of fresh water and no food except a few tamarinds. They were on board the Cadmus 7 hours, and received kind treatment. Magnus Colby, one of the crew, was drowned when the schr. upset.

Several of the crew of the British schr. Magpie lately overset in the W. Indies, were devoured by the sharks.

Prince-Edwards Island, Sept. 26.

Letters from His Excellency Governor Ready, stated his intention of leaving England so as to be here about the beginning of October.

We understand that J. F. Holland, Esq. has been appointed to the Ordnance Department in New-Brunswick.

Custom-House Salaries.

Some of the W. I. Islands having made application to the Attorney and Solicitor General of England, for their precise opinions, upon the three following questions:—"1st. Whether the Salaries of the Officers, and other charges attendant upon the collection of these Revenues, can be retained from the gross proceeds, previously to the same being paid to the Colonial Treasury. 2ndly. Whether the orders given by their Lordships for this purpose, are legal and proper. And 3dly. Whether Naval Officers can be considered as Officers of the Revenue, and as such, their Salaries or their Compensation or Allowances on their Office being abolished can be charged upon the gross proceeds of these Duties."--have received the following answer:--"We are indebted to a Jamaica paper for this document. "We think the word Produce may, according to circumstances, be construed either as gross or nett produce; and we think in this case it may be taken to mean NETT produce, that is the produce after deducting the expense of collection. If this is incurred in the shape of Salaries to the Officers, we think those Salaries may be deducted for the gross amount, and the balance only is required to be paid over to the Treasurer. We think this would extend to the Naval Officer, whether he be or be not in strictness a Custom-House Officer, if he be necessary to the collection or security of the Revenue of Customs. But if it be intended as a part of the new system, to discontinue the Naval Officers,

who have been hitherto paid by Fees, we very much doubt whether compensation to such Officers can be deducted from the future produce of the Customs, and we incline to think it cannot.

American Trade in Jamaica.—The articles which are now imported into Kingston from the United States, are subject to a double duty, the Collector of the customs and the Receiver General of the Colony, both exacting, by virtue of their different constructions of the law, the duties imposed by the 6 Geo. IV. ch. 114. A barrel of flour is thus chargeable when taken from the Warehouse for domestic consumption with a duty of 15s 5d per barrel, and Brandy and Gin 26s 8d per gallon.

MANCHESTER, AUG. 17.

"In consequence of the exhausted state of the Funds, the Committee for the relief of the Poor, are under the painful necessity of giving notice, that after to-morrow, Friday, that 11th of Aug. the distribution of provision will cease."

MADRID, AUG. 8.

The only house that exists at Solar di Cabra consists of three apartments, two of which are occupied by their Majesties; the French General had the other, but not being able to bear the great heat, and the insects which tormented him, he preferred a tent. It is said that one day, when the General had the honor to dine, at the King's table, His Majesty said to him, "Sit down at my right hand, General." "Sire," answered he, "I shall always be there till your enemies are at your feet." It seems that the General thinks of remaining a long time in Spain. It is said that the English have convinced the Queen of Portugal that for her own peace, and that of the Portuguese, it was advisable for her to go to England, and that her Majesty had gone on board an English ship.

M. Recacho is still with the King. There are various conjectures respecting the cause of this long absence from the capital.

The Council of State meets daily. It was in one of its sittings that it was first proposed, in the name of the clergy, to give fifty millions to levy an army against Portugal. M. Castanos having observed ironically that this sum would be enough to buy stockings, he was answered, that another fifty millions would be given if necessary. "Well," said the General, "that will do for the shoes and helmets, and who will furnish the rest? In fact, if 60,000 men are to be completely clothed, armed and equipped, 100 millions of reals would not suffice. The pay, provisions, and all the extraordinary expences of an army in the field must be added." A change in the Ministry is still spoken of. M. Recacho is mentioned as intended for Minister of Grace and Justice, with the addition of the Police: the Marquis d'Almenara for the Finances, and Count Ofalia for Foreign Affairs.

We have had little news: the excessive heat, 80 degrees (or 103 Fahrenheit,) keeps

every body at home, and people only come out at night to breathe a little fresh air.--
