At a General Meeting of the Merchants, Ship Owners, and other Inhabitants of Greenock held within the Town Hall there, on the 24th November 1825; called by the Magistrates in accordance with a Requisition from several Gentlemen of the Town.— James Ramsay, Esq. Chief Magistrate, in the Chair.

After the Preses had stated the object of the Meeting, the following Resolutions were moved by Mr. Andrew Muir, seconded by Mr. Thomas Lang, and unanimously agreed to.

Resolved.—1st. That this Meeting participate strongly in the general feeling of sympathy excited in this Country by the distressing accounts lately received of the very great destruction of lives and property by Fire in the Province of New-Brunswick; and conceive it to be their duty to afford every possible relief to the surviving sufferers.

2d. That a Subscription be forthwith entered into for that purpose, and that a Committee be now appointed to procure Subscriptions, and with full powers to apply the Funds arising therefrom in such manner as may afford the most immediate and efficient relief to the destitute sufferers; and that the Committee shall consist of the following Gentlemen, Viz.

Messrs. James Hunter, James Leitch, James Stuart, Andrew Lymburn, John Ker, Thomas Lang.

Mr. Leitch, Convener and Treasurer.

3d. That Subscription Papers be also left at the several Banks and Public News Rooms in Town, for the purpose of receiving Subscriptions.

The Preses laid before the meeting a letter which he had just received from Sir Michael Shaw Stewart, inclosing his Subscription for the Sufferers; the meeting requested the Preses to communicate their thanks to Sir M. S. Stewart for the very handsome manner in which he has made the donation.

At a Meeting of the Committee appointed at the General Meeting of the 24th November last, for relief of the Sufferers by the recent Fires in New-Brunswick, held in the Tontine Hotel, Greenock, on Friday the 3d February 1826 at one o'Clock, agreeably to notice previously given.

Mr. Leitch, Convener and Treasurer, in the Chair.

The Chairman explained that he had called the present meeting for the purpose of stating that the Subscriptions are now closed and amount to the sum of £487 5s the whole of which has been collected and deposited by him in the Greenock Bank; and he requested the meeting to give directions as to the disposal of the money.

The Meeting having taken the subject into consideration, several communications from other places were presented and read, from which it appears that the plan of remitting the supplies through the hands of the Governor of the Province has been most generally adopted; and the Committee deeply sensible of the humane and judicious exertions already displayed by His Excellency, and being unanimously of opinion that this is the best mode of forwarding the object of the Subscribers, directed the Convener to communicate with Sir Howard Douglas on the subject, handing him a Copy of the resolutions of the General Meeting of 24th November, and investing him with full powers as to the disposal of the money, at same time authorising His Excellency to draw upon the Treasurer at such times and in such a manner as he may consider proper, either for the whole or a part of the sum subscribed.

At a Meeting of a Committee of the Fredericton Society for the encouragement of good Female Servants, held the 14th April, at the house of Mrs. Odell.

Present, Lady Douglas, Mrs. Saunders, Mrs. Odell, Mrs. Hailes, Mrs. Best, Miss Ann Allen, Mrs. R. Dibbles, Mrs. Needham, the Treasurer, the Secretary.

Certificates from the following Ladies were read.

From Mrs. H. Smith, recommending Zillah Lawson; Mrs. Odell, recommending Elizabeth Chandler; Miss Odell, recommending Jane Richardson; Mrs. Woodford, recommending Abigail Bert; Mrs. W. Phair, recommending Elizabeth Smith; Mrs. Needham, recommending Elizabeth M'Coulough; Mrs. G. N. Smith, recommending Lucy Shearer; Mrs. Gibson, recommending Susannah Cross; Mrs. P. Fisher, recommending Caroline Leonard.

When it was Resolved, That they be all accepted and taken into immediate consideration, with the exception of the last, which the Committee are compelled to postpone to some future meeting, as it does not specify for full two years good character, as the Rule of the Society prescribes.

And that the sum of £20 be appropriated from the General Fund, for this purpose, to be divided as follows:

To Zillah Lawson, servant to Mrs. Henry Smith, for twelve years unexceptionable good character, the sum of £4.

To Elizabeth Chandler, servant to Mrs. Odell, for eight years and eight months, unexceptionable good character, the sum of £3 7 6.

To Jane Richardson, servant to Miss Odell, for eight years and ten months, unexceptionable good character, the sum of £3 7 6.

To Abigail Bert, servant to Mrs. Woodford, for upwards of four years good character, the sum of £2.

To Elizabeth Smith, servant to Mrs. W. Phair, for nearly three years good character, the sum of £1 17 6.

To Elizabeth M'Coulough, servant to Mrs. Needham, for nearly three years good character, the sum of £1 17 6.

To Lucy Shearer, servant to Mrs. G. N. Smith, for two years and ten months good character, the sum of £1 15.

To Susannah Cross, servant to Mrs. Gibson, for two years and nine months good character, the sum of £1 15.

Resolved.—That the Treasurer be authorized forthwith to transmit to the Mistresses of the aforementioned servants, the several sums annexed to their respective names, to be given by them to their servants, with the full commendations of the Committee.

And it was also Resolved, That a copy of the Resolution relating to Mrs. P. Fisher's servant Caroline Leonard be furnished Mrs. Fisher by the Secretary; with the hope of the Committee, that she will persevere in maintaining the good character her Mistress has given her, and the full assurance that she shall be rewarded, as the Rules of the Society permit.

The Committee in awarding the foregoing premiums, have gone upon as fair and equitable a plan as they could devise, the characters of all recommended, appear unexceptionable, and in one or two instances are of longer standing, than the Committee are authorized to notice, the services not having been performed within the Province: Mrs. Gibson's Certificate of Susannah Cross, is for six years and a half, and Mrs. G. N. Smith's of Lucy Shearer, is for three years and ten months, and call forth the highest praise and approbation the Committee can bestow.

The Committee deem it necessary to observe, with respect to Zillah Lawson, that although she has lived for a few months during the twelve years with another Mistress, it was not in consequence of having been put out of Mrs. Smith's service, but from unexpected circumstances; and that Mrs. Smith, by whom she was permitted to assist her aged mother a few weeks in every year, took her again into her service the first opportunity.—But were it otherwise, the Committee in consequence of the excellent character given Zillah Lawson, would not have allowed any minor objection to have interfered with their bounty.

And also as respects Jane Richardson, she left Miss Odell's service for three months, during the eight years and ten months, by permission, on a visit to her Parents in the United States.
