

about 10 or 12 feet in perpendicular height—the concussion was so great as to precipitate both of them between 30 and 40 feet down a hill, the steepness of which rendered a wall necessary in that part of the road for its support.

The severe contusions which Mr. Abbott received on his head, completely deprived him of his senses, and the injury which his wife had sustained, prevented her from calling for assistance. Fortunately Mr. Grant and Mr. A. Hay, from the lower district, came along shortly after the accident, and having succeeded in getting Mrs. A. into Casey's house, obtained more assistance to remove Mr. Abbott.

Mrs. Abbott had been thrown with so much violence across a stump, that the wounds she received were of a nature at once to preclude all hopes of recovery, and her suffering, which she bore with the most astonishing fortitude, were dreadful, but they were also brief, for in 24 hours her spirit passed away to that Being in whose mercy she evinced the most perfect reliance.

Mr. Abbott's right collar bone was broken and he has many severe bruises on head and other parts of his body, and is not yet considered out of danger.

The mortal remains of Mrs. Abbott were consigned to the grave on Saturday, and we never witnessed a funeral in Miramichi so numerously and respectfully attended.

NOTICE.

THE following extract from the Act of the General Assembly, of the 7th Geo. 4, c. 11, is published by the direction of the Firewards, for the purpose of calling the attention of such of the Household-ers of the town of Fredericton, and its immediate vicinity, (who have omitted to provide themselves with the Buckets and Ladders, required by this Act,) to the necessity of so doing, without further delay, and the Firewards will be obliged to enforce the Act against all persons who shall any longer neglect to attend thereto.

The following is the Section of the Act above alluded to:—

V. *And be it further enacted*, That as soon after the passing of this Act, as the same can be procured, every Householder in the said Town, or in its immediate vicinity, shall provide himself with two good Leather Buckets of sufficient size to hold two and a half gallons of water, with the name of the proprietor thereof, painted on the side of each of the said Buckets, to be kept always ready, in some convenient place in his House, & shall also provide himself with two good & sufficient Ladders, one to reach from the ground to the roof of his House, and the other to lay on the Roof and held at the top, by two substantial Iron hooks, fastened to the end of such Ladder which shall extend down the roof, until it meets the Ladder standing on the ground; which said Ladders, every such Householder shall keep stationary at his House, in such convenient situation as will at all times afford a ready access to the top of his House when necessary, and that on every alarm of fire in the said Town, or in its immediate vicinity, every Householder in the said Town or in its immediate vicinity, knowing of such alarm, and not being a Fireward, shall forthwith carry his Buckets so provided as above directed, or cause the same to be carried to the place where the Fire may be, to be there used as occasion may require, and every person wilfully refusing or neglecting to perform any of the duties by this Section of this Act imposed, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay the sum of forty shillings, to be recovered and applied in like manner as the forfeitures mentioned in the second Section of this Act, are herein before directed to be recovered and applied.
