We have been favoured by the Secretary of the Committee for managing the subscriptions for the Miramichi sufferers by fire in October last, with a printed abstract of the losses there sustained; the totals of which we give below:—

To the bottom of the list there is attached the following note:—“A correct enumeration of the different descriptions of property destroyed, could not possibly be given; the abstract is therefore confined to buildings, cattle, hay, and fences, merely to show how extensive the conflagration must have been, to have caused so much desolation where the buildings were so detached, and the settlements spread over so large a surface of country.”—Halifax, N. S.
