require and compel the persons present at
any fire, to fall in and form the lines or ranks
for the convenience of water for extinguish-
ing the fire, and to remain in such ranks as
long as may be deemed necessary; and if
any person present at a fire shall refuse to
fall in or remain in any such rank when
thereunto required by any Fireward, such
person so offending shall for each and every
offence forfeit and pay the sum of Forty
Shillings, to be recovered, levied and appli-
ed, in the manner specified and provided in
and by the fifth Section of this Act.

FIRE.—On Thursday evening last a House be-
longing to the Widow BLAIR, situate in the up-
per part of Queen-street, in the occupation of
two Families, took fire, and was in a short time
burnt to the Ground. The adjacent Buildings
erected since the late awful conflagration were
threatened with instant destruction, but by the
direction of Providence, and the united exer-
tions of the Officers and Men of the 53d Regt in
this Garrison, with some of the inhabitants, they
were preserved.—Too much praise cannot be be-
stowed upon that Regiment for their highly meri-
torious conduct on this as well as on all similar oc-
casions.
