

to receive the same, and distribute them as they may think most necessary.

3.—That a Committee, consisting of the Clergy and heads of Houses, be appointed to carry the above resolution into effect.

It was resolved that the thanks of the Meeting be given to David Buchan, Esq. High Sheriff, for his ready attention in convening the Meeting, and his able conduct in the Chair.

A Subscription was immediately entered into, when His Excellency the Governor, through the Chairman, commenced with £100,—and in ten minutes upwards of Three Hundred Pounds were Subscribed. The Committee immediately formed themselves into Divisions, and went through the town, and in a short time the subscription amounted to about £647.

The Committee, we understand, have been most indefatigable in their labours ever since. Tenders have been advertised for provisions and clothing, and a vessel chartered to take them immediately; and we trust will soon reach her port of destination.

The Stockton and Darlington Railway was in full operation. Coals sold at Yarm in consequence at about half the usual former prices.

In the report made to the Diet of Poland y Count Ho towark, Minister of the interior, it is stated that iron Rail Roads have been constructed from Kaliah to Brezesa, 80 German miles, in uninterrupted length (360 English miles.)

A Russian Prince has been banished from St. Petersburg for ill treatment to his servants, and other bad conduct.

Lord Cochrane had declined proceeding to Greece.

Letters from Genoa, dated 10th inst., state that the fears entertained from the squadron of Sardinian vessels, before Tripoli, have produced a peace. The Cummera, 60 gunship, commanded by the Com. Sivonis, had arrived at Genoa with the intelligence. The proceedings are thus briefly stated in the letters before us. On the arrival of the squadron at Tripoli, the Commodore required that the Consul should immediately be received, and the treaties renewed as in the event of refusal, he was instructed to commence hostilities; three days were given to consider of their ultimatum. At the expiration of the time a peremptory refusal was returned by the Bashaw, on which an instant attack on the forts, the cattle, and port was commenced; three vessels were taken and one burnt. The Bashaw then sent a flag of truce, stating he would comply with any terms which were offered to him. Hostilities ceased, and the peace was concluded.

The Jews. The Papal Government has just restored, in all their former rigour, the laws against the Jews. They are obliged to dwell in the Jews' Quarter (Ghetto,) and even those opulent members of these tribes who have purchased houses in other situations, have found their attempts to be excused obeying this order, all in vain. They are ordered to wear a particular mark of distinction—the men a yellow covering on the upper part of their hats, and the women a yellow ribbon on their breast.

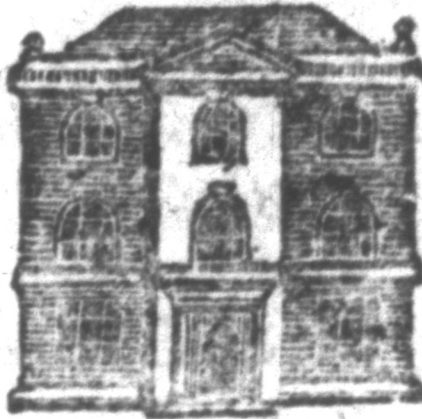
