MIRAMICHI, OCTOBER 3.

On Sunday, the Lord Bishop of Nova-Scotia arrive here in H. M. S. Grasshopper, Capt. Canning, and landed at the vessel came to anchor, attended by his Chaplain, the Rev. Edward Wix. As the lightness of the wind had prevented the Grasshopper from getting up until after ten o'clock, his Lordship proceeded immediately to St. Paul's Church in the Rev. Samuel Bacon's Carriage, which was waiting in readiness to receive him.

Before the Morning Service was begun, His Lordship consecrated the Church, and afterwards delivered a very elegant and appropriate Sermon, from the 2d Chap. Habakkuk, and 20th verse.

At the conclusion of the service, His Lordship consecrated the Chapel Yard, and then returned to the Vestry to receive the following Address.

The Respectful Address of the Rector, Wardens, and Vestry of St. Paul's Church, Chatham,

MY LORD;

It is impossible to do justice to our feelings on the present occasion, when, after having anticipated with lively interest the first visit ever paid by a Bishop to this remote part of the Province, we now see our hopes realized, and have the honor of addressing Your Lordship.

Welament that for some years past, our holy Mother the Church of England, altho' supported by many pious and able Ministers, has probably not risen to that degree of eminence which she might have done under the more-immediate direction of her Spiritual Head, but a bright ray now illumines our hopes, since Providence has been pleased to place over us

one whose brilliant talents and strenuous exertions in advocating the cause of Christianity, induce us to believe that under the Divine blessing (without which, all human efforts, however great, must prove unavailing) she will continue to shine with increasing lustre.

That every success may attend Your Lordship's labours here, and that after your earthly course is finished, you may exchange a terrestrial Mitre for an immortal Diadem,
