The report of a piracy and murder, committed under most atrocious circumstances, has been received this week, from Sydney, C. B. On the morning of Monday, the 28th ult. about 4 o'clock, during the mate's watch, two of the crew, (Charles Merchand, an Englishman, and Winslow Curtis an American) of the schr. Fame, Capt. Edwards, bound from Boston, to Gottemburgh, and at the time a little to the southward of the Isle of Sable, attacked the mate, (Thos. P. Jenkins) who was asleep upon the hen-coup, split his head open with an axe, and threw him overboard.

ON SATURDAY, 7TH OCTOBER, The Horses which shall have been beaten in running for the Purse of the first, and also of the second day, to be handicapped to run for the entrance money, to which will be added as much from the fund as will make it a Purse of £10. One Heat once round the Course. Stallions in all cases to carry 3lbs extra weight. The Horses to be shown to the Stewards, and entered on Monday the 2d day of October next, between the hours of 10 and 12 o'clock, and the entrance money, which is to be four dollars for each Horse, to be then paid to the Treasurer.

No Person can enter a Horse who does not subscribe to the Race Fund.

Should the weather prove unfavourable, the Races will be postponed, and the commencement of them afterwards publicly notified.
