Fire.—On Saturday the 1st inst. at about 3 o'clock P. M. the dwelling house of Mr. Stephen Davis of Minor, was discovered to be on fire. The public attention was immediately arrested and every possible exertion made to rescue the property, but to no effect. In a few moments, the devouring element swept away both house and contents, and left a worthy, industrious family without a "shelter from the storms." The public spirit and sympathy of the citizens in behalf of Mr. Davis was already awake, and in two weeks from the date of the calamity, he found himself in possession of a house nearly finished. A good substantial frame 30 by 36 feet was taken from the stump, raised and boarded in two days.—Eastern Argus.

PORTLAND, May 9.

Fire.—On Saturday evening last, about 1/2 before 11 o'clock, a fire was discovered in the store occupied by Mr. Harlow Harris, in Harding's buildings, between Maine and Free streets. The flames soon burst out and extended in each direction, until all the buildings from the brick store on Main-street, occupied by Stephen Gage, and Herrick's Stable, on Free-street, to the junction of the two streets, nearly opposite the house of Mrs. Cobb, were entirely destroyed.

The fire broke out as before mentioned a little before 11; and was completely got under at 1/2 past 12. In this short space of time eleven tenements of various descriptions were entirely consumed.

COUNTERFEITERS.

On the 5th of April, a gang of counterfeiters were apprehended in Kentucky, in a rock house, or cave. Three were taken in the cave engaged at work, and two others were apprehended outside. Nearly a horse load of implements for coining money were found concealed in the cave, and a quantity of spurious gold and silver, such as doubloons, half eagles, and dollars. The dollars

were calculated to deceive good judges. The coins and stamps are all Spanish, except the half eagles. The doubloons are dated 1800, with the letter S, and figure 8. The half eagles dated 1807. The dollars 1816, '18, '20, '21, '22. This establishment is only a branch of some other, as the money found, on comparing it with the stamps, was not made in the cave, but extensive arrangements were making to commence. The persons found in the cave were Henry D. Cook of Richmond, Ken. Samuel Eaton, and Jeremiah Jones, of Paoli, Indiana. Elisha Harrison and David M'Alexander, of Richmond county, taken outside the cave were discharged by the Court. Eaton and Jones were sent to prison. Cook pretended to be very sick, and from some lenity shown him, made his escape.—N. Y. D. Adv.
