the fire works used in the new piece, which Mount Etna is represented, must be lodged in the anvas, and which being set, set the whole fabric in a blaze. The fire at 12 o'clock the whole of the interior of the building was completely burned to ashes.

Further Particulars.

The flames continued to rage through the building until six o'clock this morning, when the roof, and part of the massive machinery falling in, partly checked their destructive progress; but the fire was not subdued until much later this morning, and from the excessively dangerous state of the walls still remaining, the firemen could not approach within that distance necessary to ascertain the real state of the building. However, during this forenoon, our informant has heard that every particle of property belonging to the concern is destroyed, and the loss to the proprietors is estimated at above 14,000l. The present proprietors only occupied it on lease for a certain term of months in the years. By this melancholy casualty above 70 persons have been thrown out of employ, and numbers of them from the loss of chests of tools, dresses, implements, &c. are nearly ruined. The sad calamity had nearly proved destructive to the neighbourhood, and above 15 houses have been damaged, and would have been included in the conflagration, but for the exertions of the firemen. Above 30 engines were at one time in full play, mostly upon the adjoining houses. The supply of water was abundant. A detachment of the Foot Guards under the command of Capt. Clements, were on the ground, and kept a clear space of great extent to enable the exertions of the firemen to have full effect. This service was of much importance, as it was computed that above one hundred thousand persons were assembled before three o'clock in the neighbourhood. The inhabitants of the houses west of Towerhill, and as far as Ratcliffe viewed the conflagration from the roofs of their houses, and such was the glare of light, that the most trifling storm could be clearly discovered on the ground. The flames assumed the more awful appearances of the tremendous irruption of a volcano than the result of a common casualty. The cause of this disastrous occurrence is as yet mere conjecture.
