#### Halifax Nov. 20. CORONER'S INQUEST.

An inquest was held Friday afternoon, by James F. Gray, Esq. Coroner, on the body of John Smith, formerly Sergeant Major in the N. S. Fencibles, found hanging from a tree in the wood below Mr. Newton's near the North West Arm. The hat, gloves, and walking stick of the unfortunate man, were lying at the foot of the tree, and his handkerchief was ned round his head. He had left his house on Thursday, and was not seen again till found the following afternoon by a soldier passing that way. The jury upon the evidence of several persons, who proved the deceased to have been subject to temporary derangements for two or three years past, and to have attemped to put an end to himself once before, by cutting his throat, returned a verdict--by hanging himself in a fit of insanity."
