As a contemporary rightly observes—"There was nothing base" in the poor creatures going, as they went of old, under the fear of distress and ejection, to vote for persons whose distinguishing principle was to maintain, at the entrances of civil offices, tests by which the religion of these voters declared idolatrous and so forth! This was the proper exercise of what Lord G. Beresford calls, in his election address, the proudest birthright of British subjects!

† The candidates here are, Lord George Beresford, the former member, brother to the Marquis of Waterford, a Major General in the army, and Comptroller of the Household, a violent Tory and Orangeman; Richard Power, Esq. a liberal, and one who has voted for Emancipation, also one of the former members, and Villiers Stewart, Esq. a young gentleman of large fortune, and of truly independent principles, who has never sat in Parliament.
