

The following Bill is one of the greatest importance. It passes into a Law and is reciprocated by Great Britain, the vessels of each country will be admitted to entry with such Goods as can now be imported, as the law stands, in vessels only, which are the built of the Country, of which the goods are the growth or manufacture. To elucidate the subject more clearly: American vessels can carry to England, Brandies, Silk Goods, &c from France, and British vessels, Hemp, Iron, Carvas, &c. from Russia to the United States. The duties will be the same as if the articles were brought from those countries in vessels belonging to them.—St. ANDREWS HERALD

IN SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES, JAN 9  
Mr. Lloyd, of Massachusetts, reported the following Bill from the Committee on Commerce, which was twice read.

A BILL in addition to an Act, entitled "an Act concerning discriminating Duties of Tonnage and Import."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, upon satisfactory evidence being given to the President of the United States, by the Government of any foreign nation, that no discriminating duties of tonnage or import, are imposed or levied in the ports of the said nation, upon vessels wholly belonging to citizens of the United States, or upon the produce, manufactures, or merchandise, imported in the same from the United States, or from any foreign country, the President is hereby authorized to issue his proclamation; declaring that the foreign discriminating duties of tonnage and import, within the United States, are, and shall be, suspended, and discontinued, so far as respects the vessels of the said foreign nation, and the produce, manufactures, or merchandise, imported into the United States in the same from the said foreign country; the said suspension to take effect from the time of such notification being given to the President of the United States, and to continue so long as the reciprocal exemption of vessels belonging to the citizens of the United States, and their cargoes, as aforesaid, shall be continued, and no longer.
