A BILL in addition to an Act. entitled " an Act concerning discriminating Duties of Sonnage und impost

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of American in Congress assembled, That, upon satisfactory evidence being given to the President of the United States, by the Government of any foreign nation, that no discriminating duties of tonnage or importane imposed or levied in the ports of the said nation, upon vessels wholly belonging to citizens of the United States, or upon the produce,

manufactures, or merchandise, imported in the same from the United Sizies, or from any foreign country, the President is hereby authorized to issue his proclamation; declaring that the foreign discriminating duties of tonnage and impost, within the United States, are, and shall be, suspended, and discontinu-
