FARECUTION.

London, Dec. 3, 1826. The sentence of death was on Wednesday morning cerried into effect upon John es, aged 25. James Boyce, 24, Robi. King, 20, John Robinson, 19. George Ni cholis, 24, and James Goulby, 18.

The Execution of six men at one time excited an extraordinary degree of public sympathy, which, laying aside pity for the wretched fate of so many young men, was in some degree checked when the great enor mity of their crimes was considered. The five last named colpries were connected with part of the metropelis, and have put the peaceable inhabitanis of Hack ney, Homer ton, Bethnal green, and Hag gerstone, under communities at various times, in the mis outrageous and lawless manner. The gr was called the " Berhnal green gang." en notority.

Boyce was tried with his bro the date hereof, all the er tate as well real as Perso- was acquitted, and a youth, nan

Houghton, alias " Pretty George," now under sensance of death, in the September Sessions, for attacking and robbing, in the manner described, a gentleman, named Fuller, asurgeon, residing on Cambridge heath, Hackney, and Mr. James French, in Harestreet, Bethnal green, on the 26th of July Justice of His Majesty's Supreme Court of last. Both the prosecutors were beaten in a brutal manner, and plundered of considerable property. Boyce was apprehended concern that upon application of William on Mr. Fuller's charge, and, when placed at the bar of Worship-street office, Mr. French, who had been previously seut for, on seeing him, said, "That's the man that gave me this wound," pointing to his said Yeoman, (which said Simeon Henderson hath forehead; "I would swear to him, if I saw him amongst a thousand."

The culprits passed in greater part of Tuesday night in sleep, but as early as five o'clack, were attended by their respective clergymen. Hayes remained in his cell with Mr. Devereux, and two religions gendemen, until seven o'clock; he then, in the most penitent manner, received the Sacra-

The rather culprits were in a ward in the gallery above the Press room, where they join ed in such psalms and prayers as the acred ritual of the Church have set apart as necessary in preparation for death. At 6 they received the Holy Sacrament. Robinson and King wept with great bitterness as the hour of removal approached, and appeared scarcely able to contemplate the close approach of death. Boyce, Nicholls, and the boy Goulby, were more collected, particularly Boyce, whose courage never forsonk him. The Rev. Mr. Cotton read portions of Scripture to them, and gave out such psalms as were best suited to their situation.
