On the second bench sat Mr. Tierney, Sir Francis Burdett, Lord Duncannon, and others. On the third Beach, Mr. Brougham had taken his place, together with Sir Ro Wilson, Mr. Leyces. ter, Mr. Fowell Buxton, Lord Nugent, and several other Members of the Opposition. On the fourth bench were to be seen, Lord Setton, Mr. Gordon, Mr. W. Smith, and so on up to the sixth bench from the floor into the remotest corner of the House. A more full attendance, indeed, could not be conceived -- nor did it seem possible to find room for one additional Member in any part of the building. The side galleries were crowded to excess. Many Peers, amongst whom were Lord Bexley. Lord Farnham, Lord Roden, the Bishops of Lichfield and Bach and Wells, were accommodated with seats in this part of the House; the Dake of Norfolk was also here, and appeared to take a deep interest in he proceedings. But that which puzzelled the skill of the most experienced attendants of the House was to discover who were the Members in possession of the Opposition benches, With the exception the pillar exected for the support of the side gallery, on the third bench, and Lord Milion in his usual seat, it was impossible, among the crowd of faces, to recognise any one acbusiness of the House.
