Lord Cochrane had written the following letter to the Greek Government, dated Port Piræus, April 25.

" A battle has been fought to day-it was commenced by the marines, who were landed on the several points of the coast of the Peninsula (Munichya) and drove them (the enemy) who were posted there. The land troops not willing to be surpassed in courage by the marines, also rushed on the enemy.

While the Hydriots and Spezziots were making themseives masters of the enemy's positions in this peninsula, the troops advanced on the other side of the Piræus, whence at this unexpected attack of the heroic courage of the Greeks, the Turks fled like a flock thrown into confusion.

From this day begins a new era in the military system of modern Greece. If every one behaves to-morrow, as all, without exception, have behaved to day, the seige of the Acropolis will be raised, and the liberty of Greece insured.
