- For the second best do. do. £2 10s.
- For the best Bull, do. do. not less than 2 nor more than 4 years old, £3.
- For the second best do. do. £2.
- For the best Cow, not less than 3 nor more than 6 years old, do. do. £2 10s.
- For the second best do. do. £1 5s.
- For the best Ram, not exceeding 4 years old do. do. £2.
- For the second best do. do. £1.

The Sixpenny Wheaten Loaf to weigh 2lb. 5oz.

And other Loaves in proportion. AND further Ordered, that each Baker do plainly mark the Initials of his Name on every Loaf of Bread, to be baked by him, together with the figures 6, or 12, (as the case may be,) to denote the price in pence, under a penalty of Ten Shillings for each and every offence.
