should deem it highly improper in us to give it at present, as the affair must now undergo a regular course of public investigation. We hesitatate, not, however, to say, that the perpetrators, or countenancers, of such illegal and outrageous attacks on the persons of His Majesty's leige subjects, ought to be brought to condign punishment and held up as monitors, at least to transient visitors of this City, that neither the Laws of our Country, nor the customs of this community will openly or coverily justify such proccedings.
