BY order of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Public Notice is hereby given, that 12,000 acres of Land in rear of the Woodstock Grant in the County of York, will be offered for sale by Auction at Woodstock, on Thursday the 1st day of November next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, in Lots of about 200 acres each, at an upset price of two shillings and sixpence per acre, and subject to the regulations heretofore published.

In case the purchaser shall pay down the whole amount of the purchase money, a Grant will immediately pass to him free of any further expense and unincumbered with any Quit Rent or conditions of improvement; but if the money shall be paid by instalments, the Grant will be withheld until the payment of the last instalment, and will then be passed free of any additional expense to the purchaser, and my certificate of such payment will entitle him to take immediate possession of the land, and to hold the same subject to the conditions expressed in the terms of Sale.
