against invasion, are yourselves the invaders, and, what is more, the unblushing allies of the savages, whose cause you have adopted. You have referred me for the rule of my conduct to the Treaty of Washington, " which, like all other Treaties, which have received the constitutional sanction, is among the supreme laws of the land," and which the President is therefore bound to carry into effect, " by all the means under his controul." In turn, I take the liberty to refer you to a Treaty of prior date, and prior ratification concluded at the Indian Springs, a copy of the Proclamation of which, under the sign manual of the President, I have the honour to enclose. On a comparison of dates, the President may think proper to remind the Congress that the old grant claims preference of the new, and that when vested rights have passed, the old Treaty, like the old grant, has preference of the new.
