CATISFACTORY assurances having been conveyed to His Majesty's Government of the earnest wish of the Go vernment of the United States to reciprosaic the conciliatory disposition shown in regard to the Disputed Territory, at the upper part of the River Saint John, it is most desirable, until the question relating thereto shall be finally settled, that no new settle ments shall be made, or any timber or other trees felled, in the wilderness part of tha Territory, nor any act done which may change the state of the question as it exist ed when the Treaty of Ghent was execut-

I am therefore commanded by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to deare that you will be vigilant and use your ulmost diligence to discover any attempts which may be made by any of His Majesty's subjects to intrude upon any part of that Territory with a view to make settlements or to procure timber, and to make immediate representation thereof to His Majesty's Attorney General, that legal steps may be taken to punish such Intruders and Trespassers; and should you disco ver similar attempts to be made by any other persons, whether unauthorized or appearing to act under colour of authority; that you will use your best endeavours to ascertain the names of such persons, and re-Port the same to me, with affidavits to estabish he facis, for His Excellency's consideration.
