

of Quilabattoo, preventing all vessels from trading. A number of English vessels had stopped, but were prevented from trading. Seizure.—The British brig William, arrived at Perth Amboy on the 6th ult. from Newry, in Ireland, brought out 160 passengers, "a number exceeding the proportion of two to every five tons of said vessel" by the number of twenty and more, for which she is seized and libelled by the Collector of Perth Amboy, as forfeited to the United States.

The number of individuals who have conformed to the Established Church since the commencement of the Reformation in Ireland already amounts to upwards of three thousand.

The Earl of Liverpool, we are happy to say, continues to advance gradually towards recovery.

The King of Naples has followed the example of the French Government, in disbanding his National Guard. As a curious contrast to this mode of proceeding, the King of the Netherlands has just issued an order for the organization of the Gardes Communales; these guards, intended chiefly for the maintenance of the public peace, are like the National Guards in France, to be composed of the elite of the citizens in all the communes where the population exceeds 25,000 souls.

Letters from Sydney state, that 3000 chaldrons of Coal have been sent to Halifax this spring and that 5000 more are on the surface.

**EASTERN ROAD.**—We understand that a Survey is now prosecuting, by direction of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, for the purpose of making such alterations in the route of the Main Road from Halifax to Pictou, as will avoid nearly all the hills, including Mount Tom, over which it at present runs; and are happy to learn that it is the opinion of persons acquainted with that part of the Country, that this desirable object is likely to be accomplished. In reply to some remarks of Sir T. Leithbridge, Mr. Brougham said, in allusion to the violence of the Peers, "It was right to speak of the absent with due respect, but he could not help lamenting that the prayer they had often heard so solemnly pronounced was not as yet completely fulfilled; that it had not yet pleased the Almighty to endue all the nobility with grace, wisdom and understanding. The greater proportion no doubt were so imbued—nine-tenths at least, but the residue seemed still to want the prayers of the Church."

LONDON, April 19.

A singularly beautiful fall of snow took place at Dalguise on the 29th ult. The flakes were of a very unusual size, measuring about two and a half inches by two; they continued thus only about seven minutes, and gradually diminished to their usual size. They fell at a foot or eight inches distance from each other; the flakes were seen singly at a great altitude.—Perth Courier.
