In consequence of the indisposition of the Editor of this paper, we can only present our readers with a few extracts from the last Halifax papers, relative to the final arrangement of the Ministry, &c. Generally speaking, however, the Packet does not appear to have brought any additional intelligence of moment, beyond what we have alluded to. We beg to recommend the able written "Report" &c. on our fourth page, to the perusal of our readers.

We are happy to announce the return of His Excellency, Lady Douglas and Family, from their Autumnal visit to St. John, to the Seat of Government, in perfect health. His Excellency arrived here in his Yacht about 11 o'clock, A. M.

We have been informed that His Excellency Sir Howard Douglas, a few days since, visited the French Village, to examine the site, previously selected for the erection of a Bridge over the Hammond River, and having expressed his approbation of the choice adopted, that very useful and important work will proceed under the direction of the Commissioners. On Sunday morning last His Excellency embarked and sailed in H. M. Brig Ringdove, with the intention of visiting Beaver and L'Etang

Habours, and returning by the land route to inspect the St. Andrews road, but in consequence of head wind, and every indication of an approaching gale, the Brig was compelled to put back on Sunday evening, and His Excellency proceeded from Indian Town on the following morning in his Yacht, for the seat of Government.—Star, Oct. 9.

We cannot sufficiently extol the judicious and active exertions made by His Excellency in the furtherance of our local improvements, or where any matter of Public Utility, connected with the future prosperity of the Province, presents itself to his enquiring and intelligent mind, under his systematic and equitable administration, we may expect to realize advantages heretofore unknown, or but partially appreciated, and to witness the too long neglected resources of our soil rewarding an industrious population with contentment and competency; and with this belief do we therefore rejoice in the choice our most Gracious Sovereign has made in selecting him to preside over the present and future interests of this infant Colony.—Id.

His Excellency, as we are informed, sailed in his Yacht on Monday the 8th inst. for the seat of Government, with the view of being present at the Cattle Show. It must be highly pleasing and gratifying to his Excellency, when he finds plans of his own, making such rapid strides to improvement, and realizing the benefits originally intended, and who, we ask, will deny but that his zeal and exertions well deserve the enjoyment of such enviable feelings.—His Excellency embarked at 1/2 past 6 o'clock in his Yacht and left Fredericton. That evening he anchored at the Nerepis, and on the two following days (Friday & Saturday) his Excellency inspected the new line of road from St. John to Fredericton, with which, and the work generally, he expressed himself well pleased, but a proportion of the work does not appear to be faithfully performed according to the terms of Contract. His Excellency passed through the South Bay Canal in a flat, and returned to the City at half past 3 on Saturday.—Id. October 16.

We have just been favoured with London papers to the 27th of Aug. and Liverpool to the 1st. Sept. Letters state Pine Timber at 16 1/2 and Birch at 17 1/2; and "as but few vessels would make a second voyage this Season there was a fair prospect of its advancing."—Hal. Jour. Oct. 15.
