GOAL LIMITS.

In the York General Sessions, January Term, 7th Geo. 4.

ORDERED, that the LIMITS FOR THE GAOL OF THE COUNTY OF YORK, heretofore established, be altered and amended, and that in future, the following be the Limits for the said Gaol, that is to say:

COMMENCING at the Water's edge of the River St. John, where a continuation of the Southerly line of St. John-street would intersect the same, thence along the said line to Province Row, thence along the East side of Province Row to the side wall on the North side of Church-street, thence along the said side wall to Brunswick-street, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick-street to St. John-street aforesaid, thence along the Southerly side of St. John-street to George-street, thence along the Westerly side of George-street to Regent-street, thence along the Northerly side of Regent-street to Brunswick-street aforesaid, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick-street to Carleton-street, thence along the Northerly side of Carleton-street and a continuation thereof to the Water's edge, and thence following the course of the River at the Water's edge to the place of beginning.

At a Special Session of the Peace, of our Lord the King, holden at the County Court House in Fredericton, in and for the County of York, on the 6th day of February, 1827.

IT IS ORDERED, that from and after the 7th instant, the ASSIZE of BREAD in the Town of Fredericton, be as follows:--

The Sixpenny Wheaten Loaf to weigh 2lb. 3oz.

And other Loaves in proportion. AND further Ordered, that each Baker do plainly mark the Initials of his Name on every Loaf of Bread, to be baked by him, together with the figures 3, 6, or 12, (as the case may be,) to denote the price in pence, under a penalty of Ten Shillings for each and every offence.

it seems that the insurgents engaged amounted to 11,000 men, and that of Villa Flor to 7,000 at most. The victory was warmly disputed during the whole day, but the report of the landing of the English troops, with the addition that they had immediately marched for Beira, caused a panic terror in the camp of the Marquis de Chaves. The Officers and Commanders themselves, except Count Canellas, were the first to take to flight. The soldiers followed, and a great number of them went over to the enemy. When they reached Almeida, the fugitives were beginning to rally, when almost the whole corps of Magessi, hearing of the amnesty published by the Regent, went in a body to give themselves up to the Count de Villa Flor. The remainder were terrified, and fled to the Spanish territory, when in a tumultuous assembly, the Marquis de Chaves was deprived of the chief command, which was given to Viscount Montelegre, who was able to collect but little more than 1,000 men with whom he is said to have re entered Portugal by Tras-os-Montes. The others have dispersed in small detachments, some of whom have doubtless also repassed the frontiers, as Chaves and the other Chiefs have done. The baggage of Chaves arrived at Madrid 21st Jan. but the Marchioness remained with him.
