The London Globe of the 14th ultimo states that the Greek frigate Hellas, Capt. Gregory, which sailed from New-York on the 16th October, for Greece, was spoken on the 22d Oct. in lat. 40, long. 53, 30.

Sir Walter Scott had returned from his visit to Paris, highly gratified with the excursion. He had obtained some very important and authentic documents, with which he intends to illustrate the Life of Napoleon.

Barcelonia is still garrisoned by 5000 French troops. A conspiracy was detected there on the 16th October against the lives of the captain generals, the Archbishop and others, who fled for safety to the French quarters.

At an affray which took place at Armagh, Ireland, on the 2d November, the police fired on the country people, killed four, and wounded many others.

At a meeting of the ship-owners held in Liverpool, resolutions were passed that the intexampled distress of the shipping interest was in a great measure owing to, and likey to be perpenuated by, the recent changes in the pavigation laws : and that a perition on the subject should be prepared for Par-Hament Dall Sall Sall

An engagement took place on the 9th August last, between the Ashantees on the western coast of Africa, and the force commanded by Lient. Colonel Purdon. The former amounted to 25 000 men, the latter to 11.000. The battle lasted for an hour, and was confested with great obstinacy;
