"SIR. - Though I have seen the death of the Empress of Brazil mentioned in different newspapers, yet never having heard any particulars, or cause assigned for it, 1 thought my sending you an extract of a letter from a gentleman in Rio Janeiro to a friend in New-York, might prove interest-

The letter is dated the 11th of December last, and says, " The Empress died yesterday next after the third Tuesday in February, then day at half past 10 o'clock, much regretted Sergeant James Williams, vice Lyon, the said defendent Niell Friell, is gone out of the limits of this Province, and has been have been much beloved. On hearing this, the Empress requested the Emperor to mitigate the punishment, and said that the child was in error, on which the Emperor flew into a violent passion, and forgetting the delicate situation of the Empress, offered her personal violence; which, producing miscarriage, succeeded by
