the liberated sea glances full of terror. The Ships Sarah, Young, Cork, timber road is closed against the auxiliaries of its oppressors, and the yoke which overwhelmed it is removed.

Can the Turco Egyptian army hope to Brigs Sarah G., Crowell, New-York, plaster maintain iiself on the scene of its ravages after the destruction of its fleet ? Must it not be too happy to obtain facilities for an evacuation, which becomes henceforth its only resource ? One single event has dried up the two sources whence the Porte drew its means ; the same sword has cut off the two breasis of this war.

And, henceforth, the Greeks, emancipated, will cease 10 disturb and harrass the commerce of Europe ; piracy will no longer have a pretext or excuse.

The Paris Journal des Debais states, that Count Capo d'Istria, the new Presi dent of Greece, has given up his private fortune to the public cause, and procured a small loan for the treasury, which would answer immediate exigencies. His letter on the subject breathes the most generous devotion. On the 18th of October the Austrian Admiral Dandolo presented himself before the harbour of Spezzia, and claimed four Austrian vessels, which had been cap tured by the Greeks for a violation of their blockade. When it was replied that the matter would be submitted to the Greek Government, he rejoined that he knew no such Government. After seizing on the 19th, the four vessels, he savled in upon the Greek vessels, in the harbour, cannonaded and tore them to pieces, killed a portion of their crews, and did much damage on shore. Philadelphia, Dec. 19. Captain Mclin tock, and the surviving crew of the brig Try Again, (13 in number) being indebted, under Providence, to Captain S. Baldwin of the packet ship Alexander, of Philadelphia. for the preservation of their lives, beg leave Absconding Debtor. to express their gratitude, by publicly ac knowledging the obligations they are under. The Try Again sailed from Quebee, 11th October, bound to Liverpool, with a cargo of umber. On the 22d, in lat. 45. long. 33, were overtaken by a severe gale. Dur ing the day she laboured much, and shipped a deal of water. At 3 P M on the 24 h. shipped a sea which swept the decks fore and aft, leaving nothing standing but he foremast and stump of the mainmast. Two of the crew, James Robinson and Duncau Weir, were swept over and drowned. Af er clearing the wreck, we found the ship. half full of water, and totally unmanageable, having lost her rudder. We then prepar ed some provisions for the purpose of secur ing ourselves on the foretop, but had no sooner placed them on deck than they were swept off. We were then obliged to return to the top without food or water, and there remained for four days. On the F HE following prices will be given at mothing of the 5th, being nearly exhausted, and the weather more moderate, we went op deck in search of provisions.
