"Silistria, Ghiurgevo, and Rudschuk, still hold out."

Under all these circumstances, therefore, it is very probable we shall receive some important intelligence from the present encampment of the Russians, long before we can hear any thing of the capture of the Turkish capital.

CATHOLIC QUESTION.

From the New Times, Aug. 25. That the Duke of Wellington and Mr. Peel are desirous of settling the Catholic question, we do firmly believe. But this desire is common to all Protestants. It must be the anxious wish of every good subject and every loyal man, to see an end put to the heart burnings of Ireland, and the faction which has so long ruled and divided that country, crushed by the strong arm of the law. If the Roman Catholics will give us security, the doors of Parliament will be opened to them at once. to the sovereign that wholesome controul over the clergy and Romish missionaries of Ireland, which will secure the loyalty of the Catholic prelates, and the good behaviour of the subordinate priesthood. The Protestants of Great Britain have never demanded more than this, and mean and imbecile would they be, were they to demand less than this. We have offered these to them again and again ; these terms we will offer them ; these terms, we believe, we will, before long, put it in their power either to accept or reject. If accepted, the question is set at rest-if rejected, a series of measures will be pursued in Ireland, which the Catholics little dream of, and the effects of which, we fear, they will have cause to repent bitterly. The Duke of Wellington, in his last speech on the question, stated, that if it was settled at all, it could only be settled by a Bill. The policy of negociating with the See of Rome, the noble Duke considered to be extremely objectionable. That the British government should recognize the authority or the consent of the Pope in any measure intended for the relief and regulation of its own subjects, he was decidedly opposed to. In fact, such a proceeding would be degrading to the dignity and the just rights of the Crown. It would be admitting the existence of a foreign sovereignty, which we deny. The reasoning of the Duke of Wellington was clear and convincing. The Pope of Rome cannot be reof the British Parliament.
