Both Oxen were bought by the same persons, Messrs Godsoe and Euston. — We understand they gave a generous price for them; and we trust that this example will operate as an encouragement to our farmers. We are told that Mr. Hazen's ox was fed with raw potatoes, and Mr. Hayes' with boiled potatoes; we cannot, however, from this circumstance alone, institute a comparison in favour of the raw over the boiled, because we do not know the quantity given by Mr. Hayes, to his ox per day, and besides, we conceive the addition of some ground oats, given by Mr. Hazen to his ox after the first of March, must have been of most essential service in producing the result. We however think the question of sufficient importance to merit a trial, and this can most effectually be done, by one person upon two animals, where he can be fully satisfied that every part of the treatment throughout is alike, with the exception of boiling potatoes for the one, and giving them raw to the other.

A short time since, an extraordinary ox, belonging to W. F. Odell Esq. was killed at Fredericton; we may class the three together, and their comparative weights will be—
