It is highly gratifying to observe, that the latest accounts we have seen, concur in the most favourable representations of His Majesty'shealth.

The circumstances (now so well known) under which His EXCELLENCY SIR HOWARD DOUGLAS, opened the present Session of the Legislature of New-Brunswick, must be regarded as peculiarly interesting to the Province at large: while the ardent and paternal zeal so evident throughout the various and important subjects of His Excellency's Speech, tends, we conceive, to render those circumstances highly and affectingly impressive.
