It is highly gratifying to observe, that the latest accounts we have seen, concur in the most favourable representations of His MAJESTY'S health.

The circumstances (now so well known) under which His EXCELLENCY SIR HOWARD DOUGLAS, opened the present Session of the Legislature of New-Brunswick, must be regarded as peculiarly interesting to the Province at large; while the ardent and paternal zeal so evident throughout the various and important subjects of His Excellency's Speech, tends, we conceive, to render those circumstances highly and affectingly impressive. In directing, therefore, the attention of our readers to the valuable Document just mentioned; and which is published in this Gazette; we think that a careful perusal of the same, with due regard to the event, apparently alluded to in the commencement thereof; can hardly fail to excite the utmost solicitude of the inhabitants of New-Brunswick generally: and particularly so, as the period is undoubtedly one, fraught with intense interest to all; and in which, not the present merely, but more especially the future and permanent welfare of this rising Colony, are deeply and vitally concerned.

Our latest Provincial and Colonial papers do not furnish us with any important information; but to those who have had an opportunity of perusing the continual supplies which we have had, from time to time previous to this date, the satisfaction of laying before our readers; it is almost unnecessary to intimate, that for any lack of foreign intelligence of a decidedly interesting character in this number, there are strong reasons for expecting an ample recompence by the arrival of the now-looked-for English mail.

Having published in a former number, some details of unhappy disturbances in Ireland; the accounts we have to-day copied from the *Novascotia Royal Gazette*, in further illustration of those circumstances, will no doubt be read with that interest which is now so universally felt in all that relates to that portion of His Majesty's Dominions.

We have just heard that the last New-Brunswick *Courier* is in town, containing Extracts from the PRESIDENT'S Message, which was delivered by Mr. ADAMS. GENERAL JACKSON having, as we are informed, been elected by an overwhelming majority, will take the Presidential Chair on the 4th March next.

LONDON, OCTOBER 23.

Bonded wheat may be quoted 2s. per quarter higher than last Monday. The farmers complain much of the new wheat yielding little under the flail.

The funds were a shade higher this morning, and are now at 86. The reports which interest the jobbers, are the favourable accounts of the King's health—and the taking of Varna, a rumour brought by the Dutch steam boat, just now arrived.

Ibrahim Pacha sailed from the Morea on the 2d of October with the remainder of the Egyptian troops, excepting 12,000 men, which by virtue of the convention of Alexandria, he leaves in the towns of Coron, Modon, and Navarino. Gen. Maison was to commence the siege of the latter place on the 3d.

The Russian government, it is said, had proposed to charter foreign vessels in the Black Sea. But the Austrian Consul at Odessa was instructed to prohibit the vessels of his nation from engaging in the Russian service.

It is rumoured that the Porte has acceded to the mediation of England and France for the settlement of Greece.
