At a Special Session of the Peace, of our Lord the King, holden at the County Court House in Fredericton, in and for the County of York, on the 6th day of February, 1827.

IT IS ORDERED, that from and after the 7th instant, the ASSIZE of BREAD in the Town of Fredericton, be as follows :—

The Sixpenny Wheaten
Loaf to weigh 2lb. 3oz.

And other Loaves in proportion.
AND further Ordered, that each Baker do plainly mark the Initials of his Name on every Loaf of Bread, to be baked by him, together with the figures 3, 6, or 12, (as the case may be,) to denote the price in pence, under a penalty of Ten Shillings for each and every offence.

GAOL LIMITS.

AT a Special Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden at the County Court House in Fredericton, in and for the County of York, on Friday the 1st day of February, 1828.

IT IS ORDERED, that in future, the Limits for the Gaol of the said County, under the Act of the General Assembly, 4th Sec. IV, Cap. 10, be as follows, that is to say :—

Commencing at the waters edge of the River St. John, where a continuation of the Southerly line of St. John Street would intersect the same, thence along the said line to Province Row, thence along the East side of Province Row to the side walk on the North side of Church Street, thence along the said side walk to Brunswick Street, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick Street to St. John Street aforesaid, thence along the Southeasterly side of St. John Street to George Street, thence along the Westerly side of George Street to where a continuation of the Northerly line of Carleton Street would intersect the same, thence along the said continuation line of Carleton street aforesaid, through the Burying Ground to Brunswick Street aforesaid, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick Street to where a continuation of the line between Lots Nos. 125 and 126, owned and occupied by B. S. Williams, and Lots No. 127 and 128, owned and occupied by William Bailey, would intersect the same, thence along the said line and a continuation thereof across King Street, and to the Easterly side of Queen Street, thence along the Easterly side of Queen Street to Carleton Street aforesaid, thence along the Northerly side of Carleton Street to the waters edge of the River St. John, and thence along the said waters edge to the place of beginning.
