been equally ineligible to fill the chairs of Science and of Literature in the Colleges. It seemed to him a very bad augury of the administration of those GOODS and GROCERIES; Which he offers for sale for Cash, provinces to make a charter for those Colleges which contained such a test. He hoped these tests would be done away with for the future. There were two points in which the Government of this country might interfere with wisdom; first as to the settlement of the differences which existed between the two provinces; the other with regard to preventing any acts of flagrant oppression exercised by one part of the population over the other. He thought it was the duty of Government to interfere with respect to these points. He thought the claims of the Canadians ought to be acquiesced in, and it would be contrary to national policy & justice to refuse them.
