

(the sacred banner) and the levy EN MASSE, which is estimated at 300,000 men, but probably much exaggerated. In the first instance his Highness will occupy a camp at Ramisch Pacha, beyond the suburb Ejub. Ejub and Daud-Pacha are already being fortified by English engineers. It is extremely probable that the Sultan will remain here as long as possible, as he alone is capable of maintaining tranquility in the capital, which upon his departure might become a prey to the most dreadful disorder. If the Russians should succeed in overpowering Shumla, a struggle of despair awaits them under the walls of Constantinople. The preparations making evidently announce a consciousness of approaching danger; but the government continues nevertheless to publish accounts of victories obtained over the Russians near Silistria, Shumla and Varna. On the 9th, the Grand Vizier proceeded in great state to Daud-Pacha, and in a few days he will proceed at the head of the whole army to Adrianople, whither he will be accompanied by the public functionaries. The Ministers remain with the Sultan.
