Important .- The Russian Ambassador extraordinary has arrived at Dover, and is understood to be the bearer of very important propositions to our government, which if met with corresponding feeling by the Sultan, will put and end to the hostilities

in the north of Europe.

We have also despatches and letters by express from Vienna, which mention that the Reis Effendi in an interview with the Ambassador for the Ne therlands had stated that the Sultan his master was not unwilling to treat for peace if the Emperor of Russia was sincere in his desires to obtain one, and that upon a proper understanding, the Sultan would not hesitate to send an Ambassador to meet the Envoys of the other allied powers upon the subject. This may be considered as important intelligence, and we have little doubt of its accuracy.

#### HALIFAX, NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Five large Spar Buoys have been moored in the Channel, leading from the Gulf Stream, through the harbour of Key West, into the Bay of Mexico. Vessels drawing 91 feet of water, and bound to Mobile, Pensacola, New Orleans, &c., can, by observing the following directions, pass through this Channel with perfect safety, and thus avoid the tedious and dangerous navigation of the Gulf.

They are moored in the deepest water, and can be distinctly seen from each other. The bearings are as fol-

low:-The first Buoy, at the entrance of the Channel, and nearly in the harbor of Key West, bears from K. W. Light house, by compass, N. W. by W. 1 mile; second do. bears from the first Buoy, N. W. by N.; third do bears from second N. W. 1 N.: fourth do bears from the third N. W 1; N. fifth do on the bar, bears from the Light-house N. W. by W.

The shoalest water, at low water, is ten feet, and at high water, 121, on the bar.

Vessels requiring pilots can obtain them at Key West, as there is a Board of Branch Pilots established.
