



### MAIL CONVEYANCE From Halifax to Guysboro', Via the Great Eastern Road.

DERSONS desirous of entering into a Contract for the conveyance of Her Majesty's Mails from HALIFAX to GUYSBORO', via the Great Eastern Road, passing through and serving the settlements of Middle and Upper Musquodoboit, Glenetg, (St. Mary's) and Country Harbour, once a week each way, are requested to send in SEALED TENDERS addressed perform the service.

The Conditions of the Contract are that the Mails shall be conveyed on such days and at such hours from either end of the route, as may from time to time be pointed out by the Post Master General, the rate o speed to be not less than Five Miles an hour, and the Mails to be conveyed by Horse and Waggon or on Horseback.
