PERSIA.

GENERAL HAVELOCK WOUNDED.—The Pona Observer has been informed that General Havelock received a slight wound in his last action with the rebels on the 12th, so slight, however, we rejoice to learn, as not to prevent his attending with his usual energy and vigour to his many arduous duties.

SUPPLY OF ARMS TO THE INDIAN MUTINEERS.—According to Prussian journals, public notice has been given by the diplomatic agents of England in Germany and Belgium that the introduction of firearms into India will no longer be permitted.

New Brunswick.

The Christian Visitor informs us that an interesting state of revival is being experienced at St. Martin's. Fourteen persons were baptized by Elder Smith, on Lord's day 18th inst.

A young soldier named Crampton shot himself at Fredericton, a few days since.

The three men, Savage, Watters and Barton, supposed to have been concerned in the robbing of the Central Bank, were discharged by Judge Wilnot last week, after having been three months in jail.

Canada.

A soldier of the 17th Regt. was killed some time since at Quebec by falling down the slope of the glacis. A few days since his wife and two children arrived at Quebec, having sailed from England on the very day they were deprived of husband and father.

The firm of Burstal & Co, of Quebec, is reported by the Com. Advertiser of the 12th to have failed with liabilities amounting to £300,000.

Several large manufacturing houses in Montreal have suspended operations, and nearly two thousand operatives are thrown out of employment.

MONTREAL, October 16.—The policy adopted by our banking institutions has, so far, been efficacious in producing a quietness and stability amongst our mercantile community.

ROBBERY IN AMHERST.—The shop of Mr. James McLaughlan, at Amherst, was entered by a window in the rear, on Monday night the 12th inst, and £65 in New Brunswick bills abstracted from a trunk.

An Inquest was taken on the body of Jane Holloran, in Barrack Street by Dr. Grigor, Coroner, on the 22nd inst. The deceased was found under a cart in Tobin's lot.

DISASTER ON THE SOUND.—The Fall River steamer Empire State left New York at 5 o'clock Monday evening, ran on the rocks at Hurl Gale, and sunk. She had a large number of passengers, including one hundred and fifty ladies, all of whom were saved.
