Loss of a Russian Line-of-Battle Ship? -1,000 Lives Lost.-We learn from St. Petersburgh, via Lubeck, that a very awful catastrophe happened to a Russian line-of-battle ship, between the 21st and 23rd ult., in the Gulf of Finland, during a violent storm, in which she foundered, with a crew of upwards of 1,600 souls on board, all of whom perished. About 150 were family men, which renders the misfortune still more calamitous. The vessel had arrived near the Island of Hogland, from Revel, and her dangerous situation was apparent to the crews of several large vessels of war in its vicinity, but, unfortunately, they were not able to render assistance.

GENERAL HAVELOCK WOUNDED .- The Poona Observer has been informed that General Havelock received a slight wound in his last action with the rebels on the 12th, so slight, however, we rejoice to learn, as not to prevent his attending with his usual energy and vigour to his many arduous duties.
