DISCOVERY OF NATURAL GAS AT HULL .-On Tuesday week, an extraordinary phenomenon was witnessed at the residence and private waterworks of Mr. Thomas Stather. It was that of fire and water, issuing at the same moment from the same fountain. Mr. Stather wished to sink a well, and for that purpose had engaged a large body of experienced men. Up to live o'clock on Monday afternoon, the well-sinker had hored to the depth of forty-eight feet below the surface, and, at forty-five to forty-eight feet, had found a bed of peat, three feet thick, beneath As the water now issued from the surface of the prising success. boring in a bubbling fountain, varying in height from one to six or seven feet, and from that to ten feet, spurting out volumes of gravel and fine sand, the sinker determined to try whether it was inflammable, and to his surprise there arose s lurid flame, two yards in height, issuing from a tube three inches in diameter, and through which tube the water continued to flow and boil the garden wall, which was seven feet high. acts with surpassing felicity. On Wednesday evening, twenty-one burners were supplied with gas from the boring without the intervention of any gasometer. Since then the boring has been carried down to the solid rock, which was found at a depth of fifty feet, and the supply of gas has for the present ceased. -Hall Packet.


