St. JOHN, N. B.—We perceive by the columns of the Visitor of the 24th, that our brethren in St. John, last week, commenced holding Daily Prayer Meetings: in Germain Street from 8 to 9, a. m., and in Brussels Street from 3 to 4, p. m.

The Revival Intelligence from New York continues with increased interest. Our American exchanges give us details from various parts of the Union.

Dr. Dowling, pastor of the Berean Baptist church, writes us: "Yesterday was to us a blessed and memorable day. Thirty-three rejoicing disciples, out of some forty or fifty lately converted among us, were buried with Christ in baptism.

LAIGHT ST. BAPTIST CHURCH.—This church is enjoying an interesting season of religious revival.

The principal instrumentalities that have been blessed were the reading and exposition of the Scriptures, exhortation, the relation of Christian experience, the circulation of religious tracts and fervent prayer.

Sixty-five have been received to the fellowship of the church since the settlement of the pastor, the 1st of last Nov., about one half of whom are heads of families.

BAPTISM OF A JAPANESE.—We learn that Prof. Harvey, of Madison University, baptized on the 7th instant, Samuel Santharo, a native Japanese. He is a young man who has been for some time supported by our New York brethren in a course of study, and is the relic of a Japanese crew who were wrecked in the Northern Pacific.

COMMUNION BY TELEGRAPH.—It is estimated that 2000 persons are gathered daily in the Union Prayer-Meeting in the John street church, New York. A similar meeting is held in Philadelphia, and telegraphic correspondence between the two meetings are held.—Examiner.

United States.

CONGRESS.—The question of the admission of Kansas under the Lecompton Constitution, still continues to agitate Congress, and the excitement it creates is almost the only sign of life in either branch.

A bill has passed the Iowa legislature, prohibiting marriage within certain degrees of consanguinity. Heretofore there has been no law in that state that would prevent marriage between brother and sister, or others near of kin.

A young lady aged 21 years, daughter of Geo. W. Barnard, a wealthy merchant residing in Beacon St., Boston, lost her life by her clothes taking fire from a grate, on Saturday last.

A fire broke out in the Auburn Prison on Saturday evening, and destroyed property belonging to the State to the amount of about \$5,000. There was considerable excitement among the convicts, but no escapes were made.

A desperado, named Hall, in the Illinois penitentiary at Alton, on the 8th inst., watching his opportunity, knocked down Mr. Crabb, the guard, bound him to the cell door, and drawing a large knife, threatened to kill him, unless he was allowed his liberty, and furnished with a revolver, and \$100 in money.

Benjamin R. Brotherson, head book keeper of the Union Bank has proved a defaulter in \$150,000. The money has been lost at the gaming table.

The New-York Churchman is to be published as a daily paper. This will be the second instance of a daily religious journal in this country at least.

BABEL IN NEW YORK.—At one of the recent meetings of the New York Historical Society, Dr. Bacon read a paper on the languages spoken in New York city. Eighty languages, he said, are used in business and social intercourse among the inhabitants of that city.

The African Slave Trade has already been re-opened by the South, and a regular depot has been established on Pearl River, in Mississippi, where cargoes of negroes have been received and sold into Slavery.

THE ATLANTIC TELEGRAPH.—The Times announces that the general programme of the second attempt to submerge the Atlantic telegraph wire has already been decided on.
